DEBATE








# HEALTH IS WEALTH

#### WHAT MORAL EDUCATION IS... AND WHAT IT COULD BECOME


Behaviour precedes academics and the way we behave in life determines our status. Moral education plays a major rule throughout the life of students. It is the aspect which must be given importance throughout our life.




## GENERATION GLOBAL VIDEO CONFERENCES

With this adage in mind, OOB has been instrumental in organizing a plethora of activities to strengthen the bond between the two, under the aegis of Parental Engagement from 7th to


