At the ACT Universal Inter-School Impromptu Speech Contest 2022, Ahamad Fayyad Anees of 7H won the 2nd prize while Sidharth Suraj Nambiar of 7A won the 3rd prize (grade 7 category); 1st Position (grade 8 category) - Timothy Matthew Chummar of grade 8G.

Aditya Rajesh of 8D participated in BrightCHAMPS Code, an App Fiesta and won an App Development certificate for creating a Space Time App in Thunkable. The app is published in the Amazon Appstore. He also participated in the Wiz Kids Carnival's Singing Star August Challenge 2022 and secured the 1st position and participated in the International Metafin Financial Olympiad conducted by Smart Kid and he secured the 4th rank. Students presented their creative innovations in the fields of Science, Social Studies, Art, Mathematics, Robotics and English and other Languages. Spurring the movement for sustainability, the students explored sustainable trends in fashion, refurbishing discarded items to create 'Best out of Waste,' designing and presenting their own sustainable city – 'Sustainville' as part of a special assembly themed 'Zeitgeist of the Present: Sustainability Trends.'

The Social Studies Department as part of the Inter- Disciplinary Week, showcased the UN Sustainable Development Goals - a blueprint to achieve a better and more sustainable future for all. The event -**Think Tank** was organized where students applied their knowledge and proposed an innovative idea through a model.

The Science Department showcased 'Cascading Expertise' from the Senior School, an exhibition that emphasized the practical aspects of inorganic and organic chemistry.

On 21st of September the young polemics of OOB etched yet another testimony to their sheer finesse in parlance at the 'Senior School Debate' (Science Vs Commerce). The topic for the debate was 'Metaverse is the New Normal'. The fiery exchange of crossfire riveted the audience as they sunk into their seats spellbound by the unrelenting barrage of novel ideas.
