At the Aeroplane UBL UAE Gold Junior Ranking Badminton Championship, Zeeshan Backer (9G) excelled as the under-17 doubles runner-up and the under-15 singles semi-finalist.

Geon Jibi (9G) is the national bronze medal winner, having won the medal in the CBSE National Swimming Competition held at Rishikul Vidyapeeth Sonapet, Haryana. He achieved this feat in the 200M back stroke under-17 category.

Back home, at the 37th Piyush-Ebin Sam Memorial interschool Soccer Tournament, Our Own High School, Al Warqa'a clinched victory as champions, and the home team was runner-up. Special congratulations to Ayush More of OOB, who took the spotlight as the Best Goalkeeper.
