Our boys, Deepak Gajraj of 12F and Harsh Parth Desai, of 12C, from the senior cricket team have been selected for the UAE Under 19 World Cup Qualifier team. At the GEMS Legacy Cup our young cricketers Devam Parth Desai of 5F, Ronsher Raju of 5A, Eyad Sadiq of 5E, Mohamed Riffan of 5C, Mohamed Mustafa of 5E, Aryan Ramachandran of 5E, Saad Baif of 6B, Syed Suhaib of 6B, Ishaan Roshan of 6B, Charon Guha of 6C, Kabeer Prakash Gidwani of 6A and Darren Jimmy of 6C were the runners-up defeating Delhi Private School, Dubai. Devam won the 'Man of the Series', whilst Saad won the 'Best Batsman' of the Tournament.

The Kindergarten Sports Day themed, 'Let's Go Scuba Diving', was a mega hit, even as the little champs put up an extraordinary gymnastic performance with the most colourful and imaginative races and drills. At the Primary School Sports Day, our boys celebrated their 'Meraki' attitude displaying their passion and creativity in every competition. The event also showcased various drills representing the sub-themes: happiness, passion and creativity. Students also exhibited their football skills in a tribute to the legend Pele. It is certainly worth mentioning that at both these events we had 100% participation of students.

Our swimming champ Geon Jibi of 8D won four gold medals in the swimming competition of the CBSE UAE Cluster, held at GEMS New Millennium School, Al Khail and qualified for the CBSE National Levels. In addition, he won the 4th position in the 100 mts backstroke at the CBSE National Swimming Championship, held at Rajkot, Gujarat, completing the race in a span of 1 minute 15 seconds and 07 milliseconds.

Award coordinator Mr. Joepaul and his team led seventeen students to undertake the qualifying journey for The Duke of Edinburgh International Bronze Award. The DoE team was at Fossil Rocks, Sharjah, for two days and one night. Kudos to the boys who now qualify to move onto the next level aiming for Silver. The Award is a global framework for non-formal education and learning, which challenges young people to dream big, celebrate their achievements and make a difference in their world.

The first Kindergarten choral recitation events: 'Rhyme Rhapsody' of KG1 and 'A Walk in the Wild' of KG2 were an absolute marvel, and a runaway hit! Advay Sumit of 2B was chosen as Wordsmith Awardee; an initiative by Me Kids magazine for creative writing. He was also selected as a finalist for the Little Picasso Award. Rayan Syed Ali of 3C attended the Emirates Literature Festival along with Roshin Rajesh of the same grade. Both were shortlisted for the Arcadia Book in a Box competition. Amarnath Sreevalsan of 7E secured the 1st place in the English Poem Recitation, organized by Talent Mela held at Woodlem Park School, Dubai. At the GEMS World Academy Mock UN Conference, Tarun Rawat of 11E and Gokul Krishna of 10A won the 1st prize, in the Best Delegate category, whilst Timothy Chummar of 8G bagged the 2nd prize and Smaran Nair of 11G bagged the 3rd prize in the same category.

One of the values we promote at OOB is to meet the needs of the present without compromising the ability of future generations to meet their own needs. This for us is the heart of sustainability. I am proud to inform you of the feats of our eco-warriors Anish Jena, Cherian Binoy, Lohitakshan and Chitesh, all of 7C, who won the 2<sup>nd</sup> prize at the Sharjah Chamber Award for Innovators. Their project named 'Green Clean' is a game-based project on waste management. They bagged a cash prize of AED 8000. Aaron Vinay of 9I and Vibhor Choudhary of 8F won the 2<sup>nd</sup> prize at the Terrarium Building Competition of the Climate Climax Conference organised by GEMS Modern

Academy, Dubai. Bhavdeep and Anto of 11B participated in the architectural competition held by De Montfort University to generate ideas on designing a model of a container house for students which would be sustainable, space conserving and cheap. The duo bagged the 1st prize winning a cash prize AED 1000.

Aditya Rajesh of 8D participated in the Dubai Clean-Up Campaign organized by the Emirates Environmental Group at Al Qudra and also participated in the 'Relay for Life'; a walk organized by Friends of Cancer patients at Kshisha Park, Al Rahmaniyah. Adithya Anush of 8G participated in, the 'For Our Emirates We Plant' campaign by Emirates Environmental Group in Special Bee Reserve, Al Manai and planted a tree in his name. Anish Jena of 7C participated in the 'Clean Up UAE' campaign organized by the Emirates Environment Group under the patronage of the Ministry of Climate Change and Environment.

Our champs have also been doing us proud in the world of technology, innovation and at the international Olympiads. Anirudh Ganesh of 4G won 3rd place in the 2nd Madam Varkey Memorial Pitch Perfect Competition, hosted by Our Own, Dubai. Rayan Syed Ali of 3C earned a bronze medal and successfully qualified for the school round of Kenken International Championship, whilst David Shaun D'silva of 5H received a certificate and trophy for his distinguished performance and achievement of an international rank at the same championship. At the English Olympiad qualifier, round 1, Philip Chummar of 6D won the gold medal whilst Mohammed Ayaan of 6D secured the 4th rank in the Science Olympiad qualifier, round 1, and also scored 81 percentile rank in the Math Olympiad qualifier, round 1. Aditya Rajesh of 8D received a certificate of excellence in the Genius Cerebrum Science Olympiad. He also participated in the International Science Olympiad, qualifier, round 2, securing the 12th rank in the UAE. Aditya received a Certificate of Distinction in the Green Olympiad exam too. Adithya Anush of 8G received a Certificate of Excellence in the Mathematics Genius Cerebrum Olympiad while Shaan Pinto of grade 8F received a Certificate of Achievement and the honour of being a silver medalist at the English Olympiad Foundation. Gaurav Jayaprakash of 8F participated in the Cyber Olympiad, and secured the 4th rank in the UAE.

Our School is the proud recipient of the rolling trophy at the Innotech Digifest, an interschool competition held at GEMS Our Own English High School, Sharjah - Girls. This is our second consecutive win at this competition. The focus of the event was to encourage aspiring student entrepreneurs to use technology and disruptive ideas to achieve the Sustainable Developmental Goals and enhance UAE'S SDG index.

Balatharun Kiruba Sarkar of 2D won the 1st prize at the Poster Designing Junior Category, while Om Arun Thombre of 12A and Sachin Sucheendran of 10C won 1st prize in the Programming and Photo Magic categories, respectively. Arjun Bomma of 11C won 3rd prize in Website Designing and the team consisting of Mohammad Farhan of 11C, Amin Salim Khot and Muhammad Haaziq both of 11E received 3rd prize in the Innovation Challenge.

On the occasion of World Science Day, the primary school announced an open challenge – the Genius Hour, to introduce the students to the world of scientific research and discovery and engage them in real-life problem-solving.

In the arena of quizzing our boys are a force to reckon with. The ebullient team comprising of Iraj Nair of 11E and Manthan Rane of 11A emerged champions at the 19th Gulf Asian Interschool Quiz Competition. Mohammed Ayaan Ashraf of 6D bagged the 1st prize and Ashwin Aneesh Babu of 5C secured the 1st runner-up position in the quiz conducted by the MSS Model Service Society, Dubai. Muhammed Yaseen Ashfaq of 8I and Aaron John Mathew of 9G, the winners of the 'Proud to be An Indian' event, organized by Asianet News, along with their accompanying teacher Mr. Joy George

travelled to India to witness the majestic grandeur of the Republic Day celebrations and the commemoration of the Martyrs Day at New Delhi. They also visited Shimla and other tourist spots and were privileged to meet prominent personalities.
